



Beverly Rogers Button

November 19, 1932 - March 15, 2019

Beverly Rogers Button, age 86, passed away on March 15, 2019 at Caton Merchant House in Manassas, VA.

She was born on November 19, 1932 in Williamsport, PA to the late John T. and Ann (Williams) Rogers.

A Memorial Service will be held on Tuesday, March 19, 2019 at Manassas Baptist Church, 8800 Sudley Road, Manassas, VA at 11:00 AM with Pastor David Donahue officiating. A private interment will be held at a later date at Hillcrest Memory Gardens in Jeffersonton, VA.

Beverly requested attendees attempt to avoid wearing black, or at least avoid wearing all black. She would be thrilled to see purple since this is one of her signature colors.

Beverly moved to Manassas, VA in 1962 with her three oldest children. Her fourth son,

James (Jimmy), was born in Manassas. She put her exceptional and compassionate nursing skills to work at the only medical facility between Washington, DC and Warrenton at the time, the Manassas Medical Center, which became what is now Bull Run Family Practice. She worked there until she retired.

Beverly had great faith in God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost. She and her husband joined Manassas Baptist Church shortly after moving to Manassas. She served the church in several voluntary capacities throughout the decades, including becoming the first female deacon, greeting everyone as they entered the building, and singing in the choir. The church was as a family to her, and she found great support during tumultuous times from the many kind people who attended (and still attend).

Beverly had great appreciation for music and was a talented soprano. She was often called upon to sing solos during church services, at weddings and funerals, and other occasions. She joined the Manassas Chorale when it began and enjoyed many years singing with the Chorale in the community and around the world.

Practically anyone who knew Beverly knew that she loved butterflies. The reason she loved them so much was because their life cycle represented her faith: We are all sinful in nature. God wants us to be with Him in Heaven, but our sinful nature prevents us from doing so. Heaven is perfect, and one cannot admit any imperfections or Heaven would no longer be perfect. Therefore, God provided a way to cleanse our sin, allowing us to be with Him once we pass on. He sent His beloved and perfect son to pay the price for our sin. All one must do is believe this and claim the sacrifice Jesus (His son) made for us. Once one realizes how gracious and loving our God is, one will feel the urge to turn from their sins and live a holy life. How simple! How beautiful! You see, we become wrapped into a cocoon once we begin accepting Jesus's salvation gift, and eventually emerge like a beautiful butterfly, and enter the Kingdom of Heaven. Glory Halleluiah! This, dear loved ones, is why we rejoice through our tears for Beverly. For she is in Heaven today, singing before the throne of God! No more tears, no more pain.

Beverly lived at Caton Merchant House since 2015. She felt right at home immediately. There are no words to express how grateful the family is for the loving care shown to Beverly and to the family by the staff.
