James E. King, “Jimmy” to all his friends, died at the age of 99 at Caton Merchant House in Manassas, VA on Thursday, September 19, 2019. He was born in Charlottesville, Virginia the son of Charles Francis King and Olga Irene Yancey on August 26, 1920.

Jimmy graduated from Lane High School in Charlottesville, VA in 1939 and attended the University of Virginia where he studied chemistry before enlisting in the US Navy 1942 during WWII. He met and started dating Martha Eheart shortly afterwards and they were married August 27, 1942. In June 1944 Jimmy graduated from the US Navy Hospital Corps School as a Pharmacist Mate 2nd class At Norfolk Naval Hospital, Portsmouth, VA. He served aboard the USS Shannon in the South Pacific for the remainder of the war.

In 1947 he was named Sanitation Officer for Virginia’s Nelson County.

Jimmy was predeceased by both of his parents, his brother Wendell Darwin King, who was lost at sea during WWII battle on January 1, 1943; by his sister Waindah McGahey in 1999 and on July 6, 2013 Jimmy’s beloved Martha also went to be with Jesus.

Visitation will be held on Thursday, September 26, 2019 from 4:00 PM until 4:30 PM at which time funeral service will then be conducted in the Chapel at Manassas Baptist Church. Interment will be on Friday, September 27, 2019 at 11:30 Am in Riverview Cemetery-1701 Chesapeake Street, Charlottesville, VA.
