



John Kelly Rowland

August 10, 1948 - April 9, 2020

John Kelly Rowland, 71, passed away peacefully in his home, surrounded by his loving family, on Holy Thursday, April 9, 2020.

John was born in Princeton West Virginia to Clifford Kelly and Margaret Boyce Rowland. He grew up in Dickinson County, VA, attending Clintwood High School before graduating from Marion High School in Marion, VA, in 1966. As a young man, John was an accomplished athlete — excelling in football and baseball.

In 1966, John matriculated at the University of Virginia at Wise, where he soon met Phyllis Blankenship, his future wife of 50 years. They were engaged to be married, and not long after John withdrew from his studies, to the great consternation of his professors, so that he could volunteer to serve in the Vietnam Conflict.

John and Phyllis eloped, just the two of them. They would later renew their lifelong commitment by being bound in the Catholic sacrament of holy matrimony at Sacred Heart Church, their church home for 31 years, in 2005.

John enlisted in the United States Marine Corps and served his country in Vietnam. He completed his tour of duty while serving with VMA(AW)-225, Marine All-Weather Attack Squadron, "Vikings," at Da Nang Air Base, Vietnam.

On his return to the United States, John attended the Virginia State Police Academy in Richmond and was sworn in as a Trooper in the graduating class of 1972. John — J.K., or 968 — as he was known to his peers on the State Police, was assigned to Stafford County. His friends and colleagues recall John's mentorship, leadership, and gallantry as hallmarks of his service in uniform.

In 1985, John was promoted to investigator with the Virginia State Police Bureau of Criminal Investigation, Division 7. John and Phyllis and their two young sons moved to mid-county Prince William. While working on some of the most high profile and

challenging homicide cases in the greater Washington area, Special Agent Rowland earned a reputation for disciplined, highly effective police work, and his unwavering calm under pressure.

John retired from the State Police as a Senior Special Agent in 2005. In private life took great joy in his faith and was greatly loved by many in the Sacred Heart Church community. Through his long illness, many of us were inspired and moved by the trust and devoted faith he placed in Jesus. John was a great admirer of Sister Faustina's writings on the Divine Mercy of Jesus, and he loved nothing more than spending time in fraternal fellowship and prayer with his dear friends and ministers from Sacred Heart.

John is survived by his loving wife of 50 years, Phyllis B. Rowland — who loved and cared for him, remaining by his side until he went home to the Lord — by his two sons, Robert Michael Rowland and John David Rowland, Sgt. Washington Metropolitan Police Department, his beloved daughter in law Stella Rowland, and two grandchildren Colton John Rowland and Eli William Rowland. John has three sisters, Elizabeth Rowland, Ruth Able, and Mary. In addition to his own siblings, John loved Phyllis' sisters and his brothers-in-law -- and all his many nieces and nephews -- tremendously. He often thanked God for the abiding faith and generosity, good humor, and loyalty of the extended Rowland and Blankenship families, counting those relations among his greatest blessings.

Due to the ongoing public health emergency, John will be remembered at a private family mass on Thursday April, 16, 2020. It is the hope of the family that circumstances will permit a larger memorial and gathering of John's many friends, relatives, and loved ones later in the year.
