Kathleen Crowley Devey, Wife, Mom, Grandmother, Sister, Friend and avid Red Sox fan passed away on February 14, 2022 after a three year fight against cancer. After college, Kathy was fortunate enough to raise her three children while also volunteering, serving on the PTA, being a Girl Scouts leader, always present and taking care of others while making sure she was in charge.
