



## Kevin Storey Bouch

November 18, 1942 - March 19, 2021

Kevin S. Bouch of Haymarket, Virginia passed away and went home to be with his Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ on Friday, March 19, 2021. He was born on November 18, 1942, in Dublin, Ireland. He graduated from George Washington University in 1967 with a Masters degree in Economics and then served in the United States Air Force in Sumter SC. While living there he met the love of his life, Eleanor Hayes. He served in Vietnam in 1968-1969 as a transportation officer and was awarded the Bronze Star.

Kevin and Eleanor were married in Hawaii on his R+R. Subsequently, he entered the FBI as a Special Agent and served in Newark, later in Detroit, and in Washington DC. Kevin retired after 29 years.

Kevin was the son of the late Joseph John Bouch of Dublin and Elizabeth Clark Bouch of Michigan. After living in Europe for some time, his mother and family moved back to the Washington DC area.

Survivors include his three children: Kerry Good (Brian), Joseph Bouch (Erin), and Thomas Bouch. Kevin is also survived by his five grandchildren: Riley, Brendan, Liam, Madelyn and Owen. He was preceded in death by his brother Brendan. Kevin is also survived by his sister Barbara of Denver CO.

An honors military service will be held June 3, 2021, at Quantico National Cemetery where Kevin will be buried.
