He was a gentle giant with the beliefs and innocence of a trusting child. A sweet soul who wanted no more than to be accepted by everyone. His handicap made that difficult at times, but he kept a strong appearance and would pretend that being left out at certain times didn't bother him.

He was dealt a bad hand at birth with autism that followed him throughout his entire life. A lot of people didn't get to know him simply because he was different. Now, that awesome discomfort is gone and he's at Home with Jesus. Where no one can falsely judge him ever.
