Robert “Bob” Earl Robinson, 76, died in Culpeper, Virginia on January 28, 2022. He was born on November 11, 1945, in Arlington, Virginia to the late Oswald Anthony Robinson and Blanche Eula Robinson. He graduated from WT Woodson High School in Fairfax in 1965. While in high school, he was a standout player on both the baseball and golf teams. After high school, Bob held a successful career as a lumber and millwork salesman. His love of people made him a natural leader. Bob’s true passion was golf and he spent most of his free time playing. He was an integral part of the staff that built South Riding Golf Course in Pleasant Valley, Virginia. While there, Bob formed relationships that became a special part of his life.
