May 17, 1927 - August 24, 2012

Alzine Marie Straub Cuppett, Founder & Artistic Director Emeritus of Cuppett Performing Arts Center in Vienna, VA, died peacefully Friday, Aug. 24th at her home in Haymarket, VA. During the span of her 50-year career, Mrs. Cuppett was mentor and role-model to thousands of students who shared her love of dance and the performing arts. Mrs. Cuppett, age 85, is survived by her six children: Candace Cuppett Payne of Gainesville, VA; Joyce Cuppett Miller of Annapolis, MD; Reid Thomas (and Kelli) Cuppett of Key Largo, FL; Gary Michael Cuppett of Leesburg, VA; Gregory John (and Bonnie) Cuppett of Haymarket, VA; and Amy Cuppett (and David) Stiverson of Centreville, VA. She is also survived by her 16 grandchildren and 12 great-grandchildren. “ I began dancing at CPAC in the fall of 1983, when I was entering 7th grade. At Cuppett, I was primarily a tap student, with the occasional jazz class thrown in. Two of my fondest memories are the year Mrs. Cuppett was my tap teacher and our class was held in the basement studio of her Vienna home, and the year we performed "Singin' In The Rain" using practically the identical tap choreography Gene Kelly made famous in the movie.

I left CPAC after graduating high school in 1989, but continued to dance in college. It was my years at Cuppett that fostered a love of dance that continued to grow. I am now 41 and still taking dance classes, even more than when I was a child. My preferred music for tap is Broadway showtunes because that is what I danced to at Cuppett. I am so glad I had the chance to speak with Mrs. Cuppett at the ballet this past May and to tell her that I am now, finally, taking ballet class! When I told her that I am still dancing, she said, "Yes, and we'll never stop." Losing Mrs. Cuppett feels like losing an important part of my childhood, but her legacy lives in former students like me who will never stop dancing.
