Angeles Tobia Policios, 96, of Haymarket, Virginia, passed away on January 3, 2026. She was born on August 2, 1930 in Bontoc, Leyte, Philippines to Benita Mamali and Felipe Tobia.

Angeles was a pillar of the family, nurturing, who found immense joy being around her four grandchildren whom she helped raise and were her light even in later years.

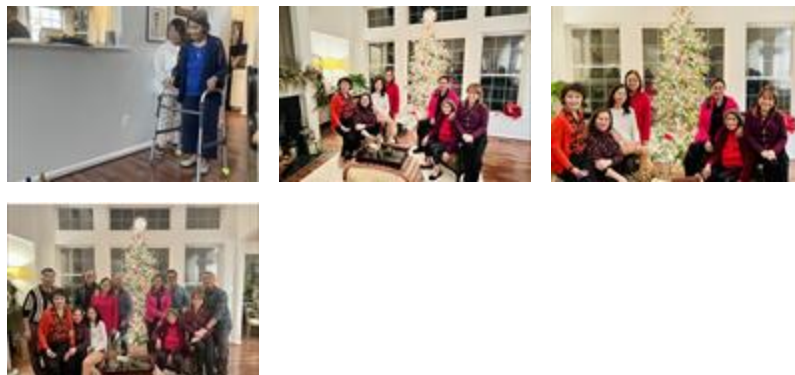

“ *My Memories of Mama Angeles*

I first met Mama Angeles in 1983 when I was introduced by Ida as her boyfriend. My first impression of her was that she was a strong woman and a domineering one, she has that voice that commands attention by the whole family, including her husband, Papa Daniel which was very reserved and mostly quiet, my thought at that time was that she was the voice in the Policios household. During our first meeting I had that feeling that Mama Angeles did not like me to be Ida's future husband and my hunch was proven when Ida told me later on that Mama Angeles was concerned that I being from Leyte with a full beard and mustache, the perception was that hairy Leytenyos are bullies and wife beaters; however, like Papa Daniel who was also hairy but from Cebu took her chance and gave her blessing to marry her daughter Ida after our very short courtship and knew very little about me and my family.

My impression with Mama Angeles changed when Ida and I got married, she was always ready to help, be it financial support, advise and just about anything we need help with. Watching Mama Angeles and Papa Daniel, I knew right away why they were successful, they were very religious, industrious, generous and a people person. Their love for one another was very strong, Mama Angeles was a supermom and Papa Daniel loves her dearly.

Mama Angeles and Papa Daniel daily routine started very early working in their shell craft business long before everyone in the house was awake, they would work all day until after sunset. They only take a break for prayers and to eat. I can also remember Mama's down time was when the new edition of the "Lagim" comics comes out, she must be the first to read before everyone else, a bit of an irony since the comic was written in Tagalog and Mama Angeles was not fluent or speak very little Tagalog. I also remembered that when a new karate movie of Jackie Chan or Bruce Lee comes out, she and papa will go on movie date after dinner. Attending Catholic mass was the first order of business on Sundays, followed by sumptuous brunch with the whole family. Mama Angeles

was very active with the Church from fundraising to CWL membership, her contributions made some of the projects of Lourdes and St. Jansen parishes possible.

Thank you, Mama for loving us unconditionally. And I pray you will watch over us in heaven.
