ARMAND A. HONEYCUTT, at the age of 75, passed away Friday, January 7, 2011, in Leesburg, Florida of heart failure.

Mr. Honeycutt was born in Derry, New Hampshire on November 27, 1935 to the late Lillian (Vielleux) and the late Edward L. Honeycutt. Mr. Honeycutt served in the U.S. Air Force in Alaska and Germany and was employed by the U.S. Department of State, Washington, D.C. for 35 years, serving in Nicosia, Cyprus; Ankara, Turkey; The Philippines; Monrovia, Liberia; Kigali, Rwanda; Pretoria, South Africa; Vienna, Austria; Geneva, Switzerland and Brasilia, Brazil.
