ARTHUR LINWOOD CARTER, JR, age 58 of Manassas, Virginia died Sunday, July 23, 2006 at Nags Head, North Carolina.

He was a 1966 graduate of Osbourn High School, Manassas and a 1970 graduate of George Mason University. Mr. Carter was past president of The Prince William/Greater Manassas Chamber of Commerce, a member of the Prince William County Regional Chamber, a Director of SERVE, Inc. and past treasurer and committee member of the Greater Manassas Christmas parade.
