



Barbara Ann Cornwell

June 26, 1948 - March 1, 2021

Barbara Ann Cornwell of Manassas, Virginia, passed away March 1, 2021, due to a stroke. Barb was born in Warrenton, Virginia, on June 26, 1948, to the late Emory Lee Cornwell and Mary Augustine “Gussie” Cornwell. Barb Cornwell graduated from Osbourn High School in Manassas in 1966 and then attended James Madison University, where she received her degree in English in 1970. She went on to get her Masters of Education from George Mason University. Barb taught public school at Stonewall Jackson High School (now Unity Reed) in Manassas from 1970 until 2012. After retiring from teaching in 2012, Ms. Cornwell cared for her mother until her passing in 2013. In 2015, Barb became somewhat of a nanny to her great nephew Graham.

Surviving Ms. Cornwell are her brother and sisters: Ronnie Cornwell (Anna Marie), Donna Cornwell, and Debbie Vandyke. She also has several nieces, a nephew, great nieces, and great nephews.

Barb Cornwell loved teaching and helping others. She was a big music fan, especially Jimmy Buffett; and she loved going to his concerts. Barb loved the beach and vacationed at the Outer Banks for many years. She had an appreciation for the outdoors, flowers, and playing and working in the yard.

A graveside service to celebrate Barb’s life will be held on March 9, 2021, at 12:00 p.m. at Stonewall Memory Gardens in Manassas, VA. In lieu of flowers, expressions of condolences and donations can be made to the Barbara

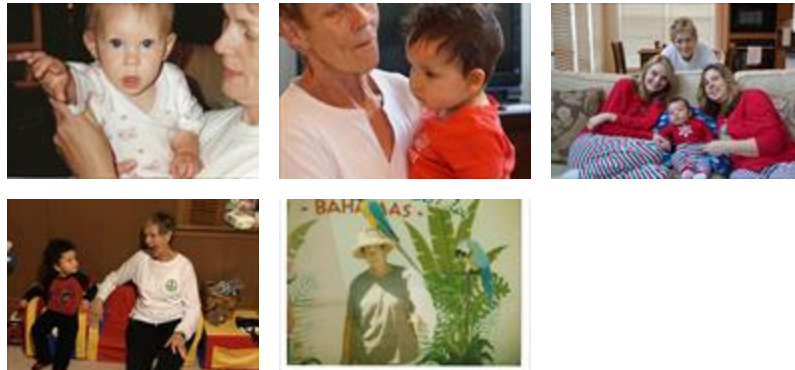
