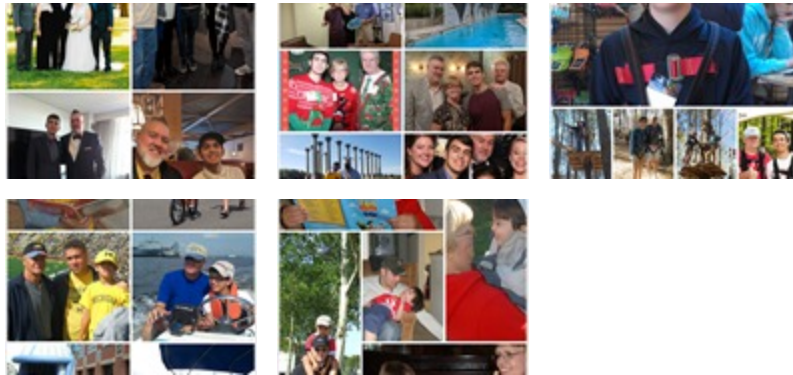
“ We knew Cameron from the beginning. Barbara, his Grandma, was there in Pittsburgh when he was born. His Dad, Brian, would take him to see us in Portsmouth when he had Cam for the weekend or we would travel north to see him at his Mom’s, Tammie, or at his Dad’s. I remember many good times - making a flat Stanley then pretending Stanley escaped when our backs were turned and Cam would pretend to be surprised. Then we would both look for him. I remember teaching him to play Chess and “90 freaking 9” - a card game much more innocuous than it sounds. I also fondly remember when he & his cousin Isaiah went crabbing along the pilings in our marina and their wide eyed look when they caught a “Doubler” and we explained they were making baby crabs. A few years later, he would pilot our trawler, a boat which he claimed was “Way too slow” and say “Let’s go back and take the dinghy”. We also enjoyed Michigan Football games, although I think he went just to humor me as he was not a football fan! His teen & later years were tough on him. We lost touch for a few of them. 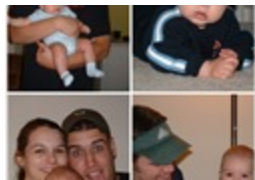

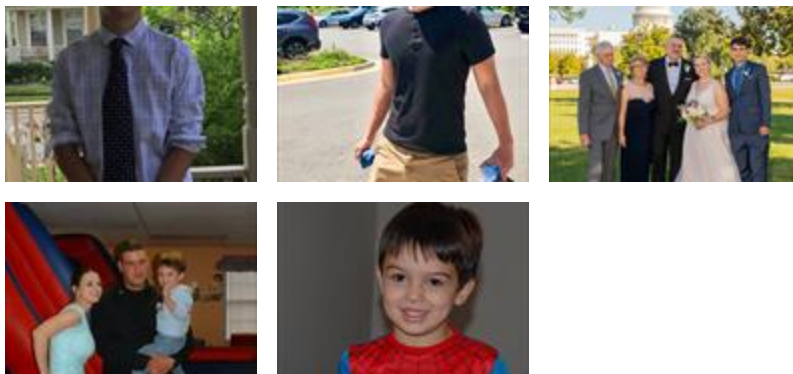
