



Camilla Smith Angevine Powell

February 22, 1923 - January 13, 2020

Camilla Smith Angevine Powell passed away on January 13, 2020, after a short stay at the Capital Caring Adler Center in Aldie, Virginia.

Camilla is preceded in death by her first husband Mickey Angevine, her second husband and the father of their children, Hudson Powell, her brother Wormack E. Smith, Jr and her first son John R. Powell. Camilla is survived by her daughter-in-law, John's wife, Veronica Powell, their children, grandson Samuel Powell and his wife, Meredith, of Winchester, VA, a granddaughter Faith Powell-Hopkins and her husband Ben, of Falls Church, VA, her second son Charles E. Powell and his wife Kim, of Manassas, VA, grandsons Christopher Powell and Brian Powell, both of Manassas, VA, two nephews, James (Jimmy) Keeton of Atlanta GA, Wormack E. (Mickey) Smith, III of Denver, CO and her niece Kathy Keeton of Atlanta, GA.

Born on February 22, 1923 in Hardy (Grenada County), Mississippi to Wormack E. and Blanche L. Smith and raised on the family farm where her father Wormack was the owner of the Hardy general store and was the postmaster. After graduating from Grenada High School Camilla attended Memphis State University. Camilla married Mickey Angevine after he returned from WWII. Mickey's life was cut short as the result of a small plane crash in 1948. In 1951 Camilla married Hudson Powell of Lubbock Texas, also a WWII veteran. The couple moved to Fort Worth, Texas, then to Lubbock, Texas until

early 1961 when Hudson took a job with the Defense Department in Northern Virginia. They moved to Arlington, Virginia where they lived and raised their family.

During the 1960's and early 1970's Camilla worked as a volunteer for the Republican party in Arlington, Virginia, where she provided volunteer work on many local, state and national elections. In 1974 Camilla accepted a full-time position with the Republican National Committee (RNC) in Washington, DC where she worked as a political polling specialist on many Senate, Congressional and National elections across the country. Camilla enjoyed a full and exciting career. She traveled extensively across the country and abroad, including two trips to Russia after the fall of the Soviet Union, teaching political studies. She later worked as a political consultant, until her retirement around 1996.

Camilla was an avid golfer, and her dearest friends Jan and Woody (deceased) Woodhead and frequent golfing partners introduced her to the Heritage Hunt golf course and residential community, where she moved in 2002.

Camilla developed many friendships as a resident of the Heritage Hunt community. Camilla adored all her friends who helped to enrich and fulfill her life over the last 18-years. Friday Happy-Hour will not be the same without Camilla, but she will be with you all in spirit.

Family members were very important to Camilla, both past and present. She loved family gatherings and cooking for all. She was a wonderful cook and the catfish fries will continue in her and Hudson's honor. Camilla was a loving mother, grandmother, aunt, and a friend like no other to so many. She loved us all very much, and our lives are much richer as a result of having known her and spent our lives with her.

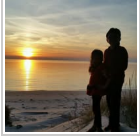

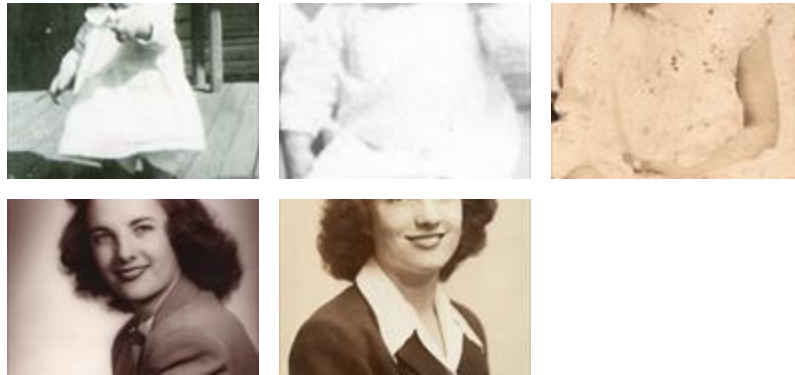
