Carol Tracy Mattock of Manassas, VA, passed away peacefully on August 25, 2020, at the age of 73 and is now playing bridge full-time. Carol was born in Springfield, Massachusetts on December 29, 1946, the third of seven children. She attended St. Anthony Catholic School and W.T. Woodson High School in Northern Virginia.
