Charlie and Donna enjoyed traveling and bowling with their friends on the Friday morning senior bowling league for many years until 2018 at the Bowl America on Mathis Avenue in Manassas. He liked country music, especially George Jones. For a while, he enjoyed horse racing. He loved dogs and was like a magnet to all dogs no matter where he went. He had a special little dog named Holly.

He was diagnosed with Parkinson's Disease in 1997, and fought a long battle for 24 years without ever complaining. Attendance at the Manassas and Loudoun County Parkinson's support group meetings with Donna helped him both give and receive encouragement to never give up. Charlie was also a 2006 cancer survivor. He was an extraordinary strong man.
