After 67 years on this earth, Charles Franklin Weatherholtz passed away on October 18, 2008 at his home in Warrenton, Virginia.

Charles spent two years in Vietnam in the late sixties. After his tour of duty, he met Shirley, the love of his life, and they were united on December 19, 1969. Within the next four years, the couple was blessed with two sons - Jason (38) and James (35).

Charles spent nearly ten years with Lee Fence Company in Fairfax, VA before taking the business over in the late Seventies. He owned and operated the business along with his wife until he retired in 2001.

Everyone who had the privilege of meeting him saw the value of a hard day's work. He was known for the virtues of hard work and determination, and he exhibited a work ethic that was not rivaled by many.

As a great father, husband, grandfather, boss, and friend, he epitomized the word trust. His greatest quality, however, was his desire to see his loved ones happier than himself. He prided himself in making sure that his family and friends were first.

Throughout his life, Charles enjoyed hobbies such as fishing, hunting,

following the Washington Redskins, and listening to country music. However, his favorite hobby was found later in life - Country Western Line Dancing. He and his wife joined a dance team in the nineties and continued the hobby until his stroke in January, 2008.

He is survived by his wife and two children - previously mentioned. Theresa Garrison, his mother of 84 years survives him along with his eight grandchildren: Cameron, Ashleigh, Katlin, Bryce, Kodie, Abigail, Kelsie, and Emily. He has eleven siblings still surviving and many nephews and nieces.
