Chase D. Kepner, 85, passed away peacefully on January 21, 2019.

He is survived by his loving wife Ann (Ball) Kepner with whom he shared 23 years of marriage.

He is also survived by his son David Kepner of Chesterbrook, PA and daughter Betsy of Baltimore, MD, as well as granddaughters Jenna and Kate and twelve step-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his brother William C. Kepner of Easton, MD (2018) and survived by his brother Robert L. Kepner of Henderson, NV.

Born September 19, 1933 in Waltham MA, he was the son of the late Ruth and Chase Kepner.

Chase would be the first to tell you he had a cherished life, both from a personal and a business standpoint. He graduated from Haverford College in 1955 and after two years in the Navy joined Armstrong World Industries. He was Regional Manager of the Baltimore Office until 1989 when Armstrong exited the carpet business. He joined J.J. Haines & Co. as the Director of Sales Training while maintaining a consulting position with ShawMark Carpet, a division of Shaw Industries. For fifteen years Chase traveled the country doing one day sales training seminars plus speaking engagements for flooring

industry organizations.

Since New England was his birthplace, he always felt drawn to the beautiful land of trees, mountains, and lakes, especially in the summer. All members of the family would join Chase and Ann each summer at their cottage on Lake Winnepesaukee in New Hampshire. These were times of great joy for Chase and all family members.
