



## Cleveland Flory

March 21, 1920 - July 10, 2006

CLEVELAND HORN FLORY, age 86, died Monday, July 10, 2006, at his home in Nokesville, Virginia.

A native of Nokesville, Mr. Flory was the son of the late John H. and Lydia Horn Flory. He was a graduate of Brentsville District High School. Mr. Flory entered military service in 1942 serving as a medic with the 7th Infantry in operations in the Pacific. During the battle on Leyte Island in the Phillipines, he was awarded the Bronze Star and later, on Okinawa. the Oak Leaf Cluster for acts of heroism. Following his military service, Mr. Flory was a fireman at Vint Hill Farms Station and a rural mail carrier in Nokesville. Mr. Flory was well known for his talent in finding a suitable car for any automobile purchaser. He was active in Asbury United Methodist Church and the Nokesville Church of the Brethren and served on the board at Prince William Hospital from 1971-1983.

He was also preceded in death by one son, Stephen O. Flory and his brother, Eugene M. Flory.

Survivors include his loving wife of 59 years, Mary O. Flory; three children, Brenda F. Ross, Thomas A. Flory and J. Douglas Flory and six grandsons.
