



Conrad Hassel

March 12, 1933 - March 16, 2013

CONRAD VINCENT HASSEL, age 80 passed away on March 16, 2013 at Heathcote Health Center in Haymarket, VA.

He was born on March 12, 1933 in Brooklyn, New York to the late Henry and Rose (Crowley) Hassel. Conrad was a Korean War Veteran who received the Purple Heart. After graduating from Duquesne University (receiving his law degree) he joined the FBI. He retired from the FBI as the First Unit Chief in the unit that specializes in terrorism, hostage negotiation and rescue in 1983 and started practicing Law in Manassas and working for the CIA where he was awarded the Silver Star.

Survivors include his wife of 11 years, Donna Hassel of Gainesville, VA; children: Lonie Hassel and husband Dan Rosenblatt of Alexandria, VA, Diana Hassel of Providence, RI and Christian Hassel and wife Sherry of Manassas, VA; step children: Michael Morgan and wife Mary of Glendale, AZ, Linda Mayfield and husband Leonard of Spokane, WA, Russell Morgan and wife Dana of LaGrande, OR and Janet LaFleur of Big Bear City, CA; grandchildren: Anna and Margaret Rosenblatt, Rose Hassel and seven step grandchildren.

A Mass of Christian burial will be held on Saturday, March 23, 2013 at 1:00 PM at Holy Trinity Catholic Church, 8213 Linton Hall Road, Gainesville, VA. Interment will be held at Arlington National Cemetery at a later date.
