“Cindy was a hardworking, loyal employee of Broker Power, Inc., who always was ready to listen to one's business concerns as well as home issues. She had a good laugh, was a boot-straps up success, and always did her utmost to do the best work she could.

Cindy was no coward to cancer. She faced it head-on, without self-pity. She found the intellectual side of death and dying fascinating. She managed her condition, until the end, as competently as she could.

Cindy was all about work. She worked for Broker Power Inc. for at least 25 years, as we went from telexing the news, to faxing it (overnight on 4 machines), to emailing it and then posting it to a web site. She lived the business as I did.

I remember when she first started. It was either work for a bank (in NYC?) or take a chance and work with me locally. She had offered to try it out for a few months, and if it didn't work out, her work for me was for free.

I was still figuring out what I was doing, with the phone ringing off the hook. I kept putting Cindy on the phone and whispered in her ear what to say, which she smoothly repeated to our customers. And we went from there to decades of working together.

We would often look back fondly on those early days and laugh, as every headline ended with an exclamation point and we used to enter thousands of textile and apparel quota numbers by hand each week and check them, to have Joe Bahler's program calculate the percent filled, project an estimated close date, and generate a report.

We worked first out of my apartment bedroom (our "office") at 12th and Mass Ave in DC, then out of the attic of a law firm next door, then on K Street, and later out at a business park in Manassas.

Cindy and I both got married in about the same year. She leaves behind Carlos, her devoted husband. They had a relationship that was solid, appreciative, and fun - many would have envied it.
