



Darrell Ray Mullins

December 1, 1945 - October 10, 2022

Darrell Ray Mullins, age 76 died peacefully with family at his side on October 10, 2022. He was born December 1, 1945 in Clintwood, Virginia to the late Archie Ray Mullins and Marie Senter Cullen. Darrell was a Marine Corp veteran who served two tours in Vietnam and was honored with three purple hearts and two bronze stars. He was a police officer with the Manassas City Police Department for decades and retired as a member of his beloved motor squad.

He is survived by his four children, Jennifer Walker (husband, Brett) of Warrenton, Jason Mullins of Centreville, Brandon Mullins of Manassas, and Ashley Lacey (husband, Ryan) of Jacksonville, FL. He was a proud "Granddad" and "Pop Pop" to Austin, Tatum, Jayla, Campbell, Jackson, Lincoln, Makenzie, Kennedy, and Kylie. He is also survived by his sister, Phyllis, niece Michelle, great-nieces Makayla and Marquee, and countless cousins and relatives.

Visitation will be held Monday, October 17th from 6:00-8:00 and a funeral service will be held on Tuesday, October 18th at 11:00. A reception will immediately follow at Pierce Reception Hall from 12:00-4:00.

A burial at Quantico National Cemetery will be held on Friday, October 21st at 11:00. All are welcome.

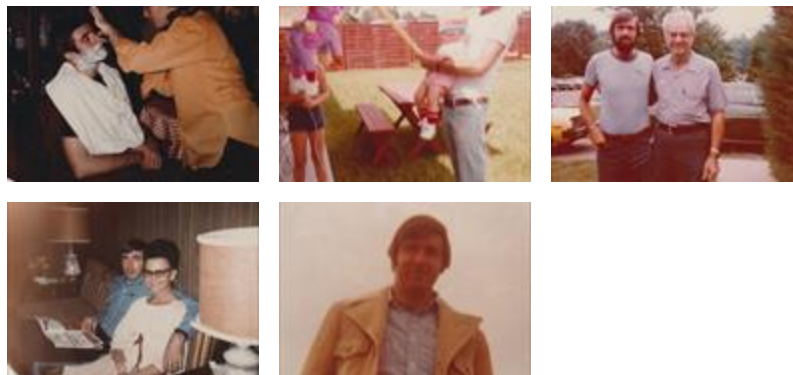
