On August 24, 2024, at age 49, David Vincent Hanna of Broad Run, Virginia, passed away peacefully at home surrounded by his family.

David was preceded in death by his father, Robert Walker Hanna, and his brother, Michael Robert Hanna.

David is survived by his loving wife Tamaro (nee Tatum), his son Lewis, and his mother Carol (nee Keen).

A native of Fauquier County, David earned an Associate's degree in computer Animation from the Art Institute of Pittsburgh and a Bachelor of Science in Psychology from George Mason University. He worked as a consultant with Booz Allen Hamilton for about twenty years before changing careers to work with children with autism.

celebration of life and his father will be held on Sunday, October 6, 2024.

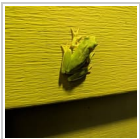

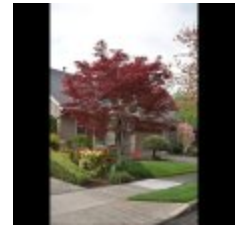
