David A. Kuykendall, aka Uncle Dave, left his earthly body and joined our Savior on October 27th at the age of 55.

Dave was diagnosed with stage 4 pancreatic cancer in April of 2015 and he fought long and hard to beat this ugly disease! Prior to his illness, he was actively involved at Gateway Bible church as prayer team leader and was the usher at the door every Sunday welcoming everyone. He always had a smile and a firm handshake. He was an awesome son, brother, uncle and friend. He was the kindest, most gentle man imaginable. A friend described him best saying "He was unwavering in his principles and ready to help anyone that he could."

It's a blessing that he is no longer in pain, but we lost one of the best and he will be missed...beyond words.
