



## Dominic Sergi

November 2, 1922 - December 10, 2009

DOMINIC JOSEPH SERGI, age 87, of Washington, D.C. passed away peacefully Thursday, December 10, 2009 with his devoted wife by his side.

Mr. Sergi, born November 2, 1922 in Lawrence, Massachusetts, was the son of the late Frank and Grace Torrisci Sergi. He and his wife moved to Washington, D.C. in 1952 to begin his career in the federal civil service, retiring from the General Accounting Office after a remarkable 44 years of dedicated service. He was a member of Holy Rosary Catholic Church, Washington, D.C., a member of the Holy Name Society, the Knights of Columbus, 3rd Degree, and a member of the Franciscan Third Order.
