



## Dorothy Young

March 3, 1925 - November 27, 2007

Dorothy Ruth Young (Dotty) died peacefully on November 27, 2007 in Gainesville, Virginia, surrounded by family.

Dotty was born in Baton Rouge, Louisiana on March 3, 1925. She graduated from Baton Rouge Senior High School and then attended Louisiana State University where she was active in student government and other activities.

Married in 1944 to career US Army officer Charles Morton Young, Jr. (Pop), Dotty stayed active in civic, church and community activities, all while raising four children and moving her household and family fifteen times between 1945 and 1973. The couple then retired to Orlando, Florida where they lived for twenty-nine years before moving to Richmond in December of 2001. They were married for sixty-one years. Dotty moved to Gainesville in 2005 after the death of her husband.

Dotty is survived by her children Charles Morton Young III (Nancy) of Claremont, CA, Dorothy Converse Young of Gainesville, VA, Dale Christopher Young (Martha) of Richmond, VA, and Corwin Walker Young (Karen) of Chantilly, VA, by her brothers Robert Warren Christopher and James Lee Christopher, both of New Roads, LA, and by her seven grandchildren, Christopher Lee Young, Charles Royster Young and Virginia Winston Young of Richmond and Brian Charles Young, Matthew Joseph Young, Katherine Anne

In addition to Pop, Dotty was preceded in death by her brother Willard Neil Christopher.
