November 7, 1924 - November 3, 2012

Eiko S. Fry, age 87 of Haymarket, VA died on Saturday, November 3, 2012 at her home.

Mrs. Fry is predeceased by her husband Clarence Allen Fry and one son Paul Raymond Fry and granddaughter Paula Morris.
