December 15, 1924 - January 31, 2015

Fred Kuta, age 90 of Centreville, Virginia died on January 31, 2015 at Inova Fair Oaks Hospital.

He was born on December 15, 1924 in Cleveland, Ohio, son of the late Mary Chocholowicz and George Kuta. He served in the United States Army during World War II and was a Prisoner of War and received the Purple Heart. He retired as an Adjudication Officer for the Veterans Administration.
