



## Frederick Eggermann

November 12, 1944 - October 13, 2023

Frederick Martin Eggermann, 78, of Vero Beach, FL, passed away in Bristow, VA on October 13, 2023, surrounded by loved ones. Born on November 12, 1944, in Mineola, NY, Fred was the beloved husband of Linda Eggermann, father of three daughters, grandfather of six, brother-in-law, uncle and friend to many.

Fred cherished his family dearly. He is survived by his loving wife of 51 years, Linda, and his brother, Paul (Barbara). Fred was a devoted father to his daughters, Debbie (Jason), Stefanie (Greg) Kupka, and Katie (Jeremiah) Beck. He was also a proud Grandpa to Andrew, Julia, Maddie, Eleanor, Owen, and Ben.

Fred was preceded in death by his parents, Peter and Julia and brother Edward. He will be deeply missed by his family, friends, and all who knew him. Fred grew up in Great Neck, NY. He attended St. Mary's Catholic High School, graduating in 1962, and had endless stories and jokes about nuns with rulers. After high school he was drafted into the military and served in the Army until 1968, located primarily in Kaiserslautern, Germany. After his military service, he continued his studies at Long Island University - C.W. Post, graduating with a B.S. in Business Management in 1972 and an M.B.A. in 1977. While pursuing these degrees he worked full time over the years either selling ice skates, working at an electronics store, or at Goldsmith's Music Shop. Fred began working as a Systems Applications Consultant at Grumman Corporation in January 1979. His career moved him from New York to Florida

to Texas and then back to Florida where he officially retired from the company in February 2007. He continued to work for Northrop Grumman as an SAP Consultant until 2017, when he finally retired for what seemed like the 10th time.

From an early age, Fred enjoyed amateur “ham” radios and his call sign was WA2NOJ. He was active in the Florida ham radio community, assisting others in pursuing their amateur radio license. Fred was extremely handy and could fix just about anything. He was an accomplished teller of dad jokes with a neverending supply in his Dad-a-base. He enjoyed traveling and loved to bring the whole family together for annual trips to the beach. Fred loved food almost as much as his family, especially lobster, potato chips and ice cream. He enjoyed cooking and loved to make his family Fred’s Fabulous Fantastic Fancakes on the weekends. In retirement, he became an avid coin collector and loved to attend coin shows and auctions.

Fred was a fighter and survivor with a quiet determination. Over the past 18 years, he survived four different unrelated cancers. It was the fifth cancer that eventually took his life, though he fought it to the bitter end.

We remember Fred for his dedication to his work, his commitment to his family, and his honorable service to his country. His presence will be greatly missed, but his memory will forever be cherished.
