



Dr. George Karl Seitz

September 5, 1929 - October 31, 2022

Dr. George Karl Seitz, 93, of Manassas, Virginia, passed away on October 31, 2022. He died peacefully at home surrounded by his loving family. He was born in Berlin, Germany in 1929. He was 15 when WWII ended and the Russian occupation of his home town began. He finished his preclinical medical studies in 1952 and then defected to West Germany to finish medical school in 1955. During a 2-year internship at Monmouth Memorial Hospital in Longbranch, NJ, he met Brigitte Weiss. They were engaged in 1957 and returned to Germany where he worked for two years at the US Army Hospital in Heidelberg as an OBGYN. George and Brigitte were married in 1959 and immigrated to America. He was the first OBGYN to practice in Manassas in 1962. Over the next 30 years he delivered over 5,000 babies and was proud of his life's work. He was an avid gardener and world traveler and a devoted care-giver to his wife during her long illness.

He joins his beloved wife of 56 years, Brigitte Renate Seitz, and his brother, Heinz, in eternal rest. He is survived by his children, Suzanne Seitz and Christopher Seitz; grandchildren, Christina Barnes, Anna Holowinsky, Sophia Seitz, Katharina Seitz and James Dapogny; and great-grandson, Henry Barnes.

A funeral service will be held at 12:00 PM on December 1, 2022, at Pierce Funeral Home (9609 Center Street, Manassas, Virginia 20110). Burial will

follow immediately after the funeral service at 2:00 PM at Stonewall Memory Gardens (12004 Lee Highway, Manassas, Virginia 20109).

Dr. Seitz was such a good doctor, so compassionate and caring. He delivered two of my children, a daughter in 1964 and a son in 1975. My daughter was born on a Sunday, and I believe he stayed there at the hospital with me all day (maybe because I had complained so much to him about the way I had been treated when my first daughter was born - she was born in 1962 before he came to Manassas). I had a pinched nerve during the last month of my pregnancy in 1975 and could barely put one foot in front of the other, so I called his office to see whether I could take something for it. They called back to inform me that I would just have to "live with it" until my baby was born. I saw him in a department store a few days later. Not only did he recognize me, but he asked about the pinched nerve! I remained one of his patients until he retired.
