



Dr. Godfrey Gwaze Sikipa

June 6, 1951 - May 5, 2025

This is a story of a public health medical champion in Africa, who started his journey in Zimbabwe and took the fight for Health for All to continental Africa before taking it to the global community.

Dr. Godfrey Gwaze Sikipa passed away on the 5th of May 2025 in Virginia, USA, after a twenty-year battle with cancer, which he faced with optimism and determination. He was surrounded by his family at the time of his passing. He is survived by his wife, Dolly; his sons, Tapiwa, Shingayi, Rufaro and Farai; and his grandchildren, Jamie, Josh, Sophie, Daniel and Benji.

Born in 1951 in Goromonzi, Dr. Sikipa was the eighth of ten siblings. His parents were Gwaze and Edinah (nee Kamvuri) Sikipa. He attended Fletcher High School in Gweru. Dr. Sikipa trained as a medical doctor at the University of Rhodesia before going to the United Kingdom to specialize as a Public Health Specialist. He joined the Ministry of Health and rose through the ranks from Medical Officer at Kwekwe General Hospital to become the first Provincial Medical Director of the newly formed Mashonaland West. In recognition of his strong leadership in public and primary health care, as well as his commitment to expanding access to health services for all, he was appointed to lead Zimbabwe's Ministry of Health —first as Principal Medical Director and soon after as Permanent Secretary under Minister Dr. Timothy Stamps.

Dr Sikipa subsequently moved into international public health to head the Family Health International Africa Program in Washington DC before coming to set up the African Headquarters in Nairobi, Kenya. After setting up the office, he joined the UNAIDS headquarters in Geneva, to head the African AIDS Program. He later moved to the United States, joining RTI International, a nonprofit organization headquartered in the Research Triangle Park in North Carolina, USA that provides research and technical services. During his time overseas, he served as a Member of the Technical Evaluation Reference Group of the Global Fund to fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria.

As his continued contribution to Zimbabwe's national development, he served on the Presidential Advisory Council to the President of Zimbabwe (2018-2023), served as Chairman of the Parirenyatwa Group of Hospitals Management Board and was a member of the Zimbabwe College of Public Health Physicians, which supported the Ministry of Health in continuing to advance public and primary health care and in the national response to COVID-19. He also served on the Board of Zimbabwe Island Hospice and Healthcare, the first hospice in Africa.

His community-centered upbringing in Goromonzi, unwavering belief in the strength of love and family and more so the extended family, service to the nation, as well as his strong will power, resulted in a life fully dedicated to service to others, epitomized by the expression, "one life lived, many lives touched"

Godfrey Sikipa was a dear friend, colleague, and a truly inspiring action and result-driven Zimbabwean Public Health leader, he leaves rich memories and a future legacy for us all to continue. Godfrey took forward the call to deliver health services to all Zimbabweans through the post-independent drive by legendary health leaders and heroes; Dr Herbert Ushewekunze, Dr Office Chidede and Dr Daniel Makuto with Policy on Equity in Health with Free Health at Point of Delivery for All, through Primary Health Care, District Health Systems, and accessible District and Provincial Hospitals. Our professional and family bonds start from our work as medical officers in the Midlands Province and Mashonaland Province. This joint journey of our lives continued in 1983 with our many colleagues and friends and our postgraduate training in Mother and Child Health, Tropical Medicine, and Public Health in the UK. He was the first Provincial Medical Director for Mashonaland West, and I was then his Medical Superintendent of Chinoyi Provincial Hospital, culminating in advancing Primary Health Care in Mokonde District, Mashonaland West Province, and planning and financing the new Chinoyi Provincial Hospital. Subsequently, at the Ministry of Health Head Office as Principal Medical Director and Permanent Secretary for Health, and I as Chief Epidemiologist and Director of Epidemiology and Disease Control, and onwards internationally in Family Health and Disease Prevention and Control, Global Public Health.

Godfrey and Dolly always welcomed me, initially Shiva and then with Liz, into their house, and we continued with shared godsons Rufaro Sikipa and Arjuna Sivakumaran and the rest of the tribe. Godfrey was always concerned about the family and how they were fairing. His first question How are the babies? Even when they were grown adults, and more recently – how are the little ones?

Godfrey and Dolly wherever they lived were a centre of hospitality for all, and their young men and their wives and their evolving

football club of grandchildren. He was always committed to his large extended family, we met at his home; his sisters and brothers, and he walked the extra mile in mentoring and supporting several nieces and nephews.

We remember the long family discussions always came back at all times to Health for All Zimbabweans, and he was always proactive with ideas for what is next, looking at ways to revitalise the ailing public health sector in Zimbabwe, but always ready to share ideas over a beer or meal.

Godfrey was one of the founding fathers of Zimhealth Europe together with Daniel Makuto, created in Geneva in 2008 in response to the challenges of the health system in Zimbabwe, and mobilised Zimbabweans in the US, setting up the US chapter. During the Covid pandemic Godfrey mobilised many of us to form a network of Health Elders creating and the first chair of the Health Sector Advisory Network, HASN.

“ I am deeply shocked and saddened by the passing of Dr. Godfrey Gwaze Sikipa on May 5, 2025, in Virginia, USA. News of his death came as a great surprise, and it is difficult to imagine the public health landscape without his steady presence and visionary leadership. His loss is not only personal but a significant blow to the public health community.

I had the privilege of working closely with Dr. Sikipa early in my career, an experience that profoundly shaped my professional journey. After completing my Masters in Public Health, my first posting was at Compre Health Services, the organization he founded with his colleague and friend Dr Evaristo Marowa with the mission to deliver comprehensive health services and strengthen health systems. Under his guidance, I served as the Program Manager for a PEPFAR/CDC-supported Ministry of Health and Child Care (MOHCC) HIV Clinical Mentorship Programme, which Compre Health Services was part of the implementing partners (I-TECH Consortium). This role marked my first exposure to working within the broader public health system, and I was fortunate to have Dr. Sikipa as both my supervisor and mentor.

Dr. Sikipa was more than a leader-he was a true mentor. His mentorship was rooted in decades of experience at various levels of management within the MOHCC (district and province), where he served as Permanent Secretary from 1990 to 1992, and at the international level, including roles with organizations such as FHI, the Global Fund, and Management Sciences for Health (MSH). His deep understanding of public health, policy, and program implementation was matched only by his commitment to building the capacity of those around him.

Reflecting on my time working with him at Compre Health Services, I am reminded of the invaluable skills I gained under his mentorship. One of the most important was report writing. Dr. Sikipa was exceptionally particular about the quality of reports, especially those destined for donors and funders. He would meticulously review

each report, providing detailed guidance on language, structure, and clarity before giving approval to submit. I vividly recall how he would patiently correct my common mistakes, such as confusing “contact” with “conduct,” always emphasizing precision and professionalism. Through his guidance and high standards, I grew to become an expert in report writing, a skill that has served me throughout my career.

Another invaluable lesson I learned from Dr. Sikipa was his approach to conflict resolution. He always emphasized that the best way to resolve conflict was to directly engage with the person you were having a misunderstanding with. Dr. Sikipa was firmly against involving intermediaries or sending emissaries, believing that this could worsen the situation if messages were miscommunicated or intentions misunderstood. His advice was simple but powerful: speak directly and honestly with the person involved. Ever since adopting his approach, I have seen firsthand how effective it is. I no longer believe in using mediators, and this direct engagement has consistently helped me resolve issues more constructively.

In conclusion, Dr. Sikipa’s mentorship has been instrumental in shaping my current career. The skills and values he instilled in me continue to guide my work as a lecturer, where I am privileged to train and inspire future public health professionals. His legacy lives on not only through the systems he helped strengthen but also through the countless individuals like myself whom he empowered to make a difference. I am forever grateful for his guidance and will carry his lessons forward with great honor.

Godfrey, in 1989, through his unrelenting persuasive nature lured me to Harare from Masvingo. That was the beginning of a strong partnership at work and the foundation of our families' friendship. These bonds continued after we each retired at different times from Government employment as we met again in Kenya and thereafter in Africa and the world beyond.

I remember Godfrey as a strong willed public health practitioner who wanted decisions to be based on evidence and professional discipline. One Friday morning sometime in 1990 while chairing a meeting at Park Lane Hotel he asked a medical practitioner who was disrupting the meeting to leave. A few days later the same person was appointed Minister of Health. The weekend after the meeting I travelled abroad on mission, he called to announce the news to me on the Tuesday saying “ You have a new Minister. The one we want to remove from the meeting last Friday. I have explained myself. When you come you must go and introduce yourself, and remember to say Sir, that Friday we were doing our job as is expected of us”!

Around the same time, based on projections made on analysis at Blood Transfusion Services Godfrey made a media statement that there were about 250 000 HIV positive people in the country. This was during the days of HIV denial. The Head of State was not amused. He said that he will ask Godfrey to bring the 250 000 Zimbabweans infected with HIV and show them to him!

These were tough times. Little did we know these skirmishes around HIV were to prepare Godfrey for the work his was to do later in his life.
