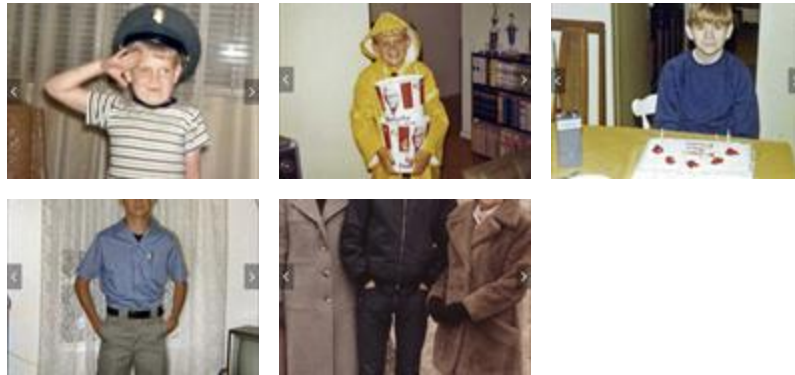

Gordon was very brave as a child born with congenital heart disease. Our family was always grateful for the expert cardiac surgeons and physicians who saved Gordon's life three times at ages 3 weeks, 11 years and as an adult and who treated him during 6 week hospitalization with a serious heart infection.

When our mother developed Alzheimer's Disease, Gordon brought her from Virginia to Indiana so that she could be cared for first at his own home and then when her condition worsened later at an excellent nursing home nearby.
