Harold Royer Weybright, age 89 of Nokesville, VA died on Friday, October 15, 2021 at Blue Ridge Christian Homes.

Mr. Weybright was born in Thurmont, MD on February 11, 1932, son of the late Daniel Saylor Weybright and Anna Royer Weybright.
