Jacqueline Virginia Ellen (Sullivan) LeRoy, 91, of Nokesville, died Monday, June 6, 2016.

Jacqueline's love, "Mac" passed away in June 2013. She is survived by her children, Mark A. LeRoy, Jacqueline M. McCombe, Evelyn A. DeWald, and Robin D. Clemen with loving son-in-law Burnard; and her sister, Aimee Lee Eddins; 11 grandchildren and 24 great grandchildren.

“*My Beautiful Muff. With you leaving, it feels like my wind has been taken a bit... so happy that you are in peace, reunited with Granddad, your parents, but so sad that this chapter has closed. I was so proud that you were my grandmother, always the best dressed, most elegant, most exquisitely perfumed... I can remember you waiting for me after a dance concert: luxurious fur trimmed hat and sweater, silk patterned blouse underneath, sophisticated tweed pants, leather ankle boots and leather gloves, stunning large curls, satin pink lipstick, little bit of pastel eyeshadow... Gorgeous. It makes me smile so big to think about that. We were pen pals during that period and I loved getting your letters then, but absolutely cherish having them now. The recipes, the sweetness, the anecdotes, and daily happenings, including adventures of Foxy the dog, they were all wonderful notes. Sometimes you would include pictures: you would take pictures of the the skyline outside your kitchen sink window... The trees and shrubs would appear black against a pink, coral, or very light blue sky. On the night you passed, I happened to be doing dishes and just like out of your kitchen window, I noticed the dark trees as the sun set behind them. I thank you dearly for that.*

My funniest Muff moment is when Granddad and I thought we would be charitable ;) and help you out with your never ending housework. I think we took clean sheets upstairs and you said that the mattress had to be turned and flipped first. So we thought, innocently, "no problem, how hard can that be," so we proceeded to turn the mattress and you came in like a tornado :) told us we were doing it wrong, and then, in your petite frame, and I think I remember this correctly, got under the mattress and flipped and turned it AT THE SAME TIME. We were equal parts ashamed yet AMAZED by the display of athleticism, balance, and muscular endurance. Granddad and I left with our tail between our legs, but then you made us a great meal so you forgave us.

Lucky for me so many of your traits have been passed down: My mom got your beauty. For sure. What a gift. Not only did you give her the raw materials, you taught her HOW to be pretty; she never



forgot - it's an art and you were a great teacher. Mom also vacuums JUST LIKE YOU: vacuum turned on and STAYS ON until finishing the whole house with ATTACHMENTS vice the actual floor vacuum. It makes me laugh every time. My daughter has your fashion sense, completely, and your touch, a very soft touch. But best of all, my son eats at the EXACT same pace as you. He enjoys every bite. I received a compliment once and I attributed it to you. It was from a neighbors preteen daughter. I made sandwiches for lunch for everybody in the vicinity when we were moving. I remembered when I was a kid that you would make us lunch, but it was NO ORDINARY lunch... Artisan bread, deli muenster cheese, deluxe rare roast beef slices, fresh, crisp iceberg lettuce, gourmet mayo and mustard, fresh milled pepper, the works... Neatly sliced, served with chips and a drink. I remember it vividly and took that model to heart anytime I have prepared lunch for my family and guests that we had. Fast forward to our recent move, and said young lady comes over for lunch. She's very quiet for a time... I have no indication that her lunch is even satisfactory except for the lack of any trace of food left on her plate. Hours later her mother comes hurriedly to my door with a pen and notepad.

"My daughter says you made the best sandwich she's ever had and she never eats what I make so can you please tell me what you did/what you used?"

So, I replied that my grandmother was a very talented chef and artist, and through her actions taught me the art of buying good groceries and using them to make great meals including the common lunchtime sandwich. I proceeded to share my grocery lists and preparation tips to her delight, but was most happy about what I attributed to my time with you, Muff. Taking time, doing things right, you get what you pay for (oh, wait, that was Granddad), and knowing how to cook for and nurture your family (what I'm pretty sure my husband thinks is the most important lesson I've ever learned). With a heart full of life long gratitude I thank you for everything you ever shared, said, or did, that I have held onto and used as my blueprint. You were an absolute super glue to an amazing family and I have such appreciation for every gathering you facilitated and every good lesson you taught us. You were a

fantastic grandmother and friend and I will miss you dearly for my remaining days. I love you forever, kate
