James Clinton Reese Jr., 82 of Manassas, Virginia went home to be with the Lord on Tuesday, September 2. He is re-united in love with his bride Marjorie who passed away August 19 and his son Jimmie. He died peacefully at Alexandria Hospital with his family by his side, praising God and giving thanks for his home going.

Jim is preceded in death by his parents, Sudie Caroline Whitmire Reese and James Clinton Reese Sr., his wife Marjorie Teresa Canino Reese, son James Craig Reese and his sister Sallie Ann Zana DiCarlo.

He is survived by his daughters Pamela (David) Comer of Harrisonburg, VA and Tracie (Matt) Reavis of Warrenton, VA. He leaves behind three grandchildren Matthew and Carson Reavis and Sierra Comer who will miss him dearly.

Jim was a career military officer who dedicated his life to protecting and serving a nation he was so very proud to be a citizen of. At his retirement from the Army, Jim was a Chief Warrant Officer 4. He was a highly decorated veteran who received many accolades for his years of work in military intelligence and signals warfare. He is highly respected amongst his peers. He received the Knowlton Award for recognition of significant contributions to the military intelligence field in which a soldier must hold the highest degree of integrity, moral character, and outstanding professional competence. Jim has also been nominated for the Military Intelligence Hall of Fame.

Jim and Marge spent many years traveling abroad and in the states until they

settled the family in Manassas in the 70's. Many community members remember Jim as an umpire in Manassas Park. He loved to fish with and read to his young grandsons. He enjoyed family games and was an avid Washington Nationals fan. Jim was a humble, God fearing man who had tremendous faith and treasured family.
