Jane Metcalf Seeberg, age 85, passed away peacefully at home on Saturday, December 8, 2018 surrounded by her loving family.

Jane was born on August 25, 1933, on the family farm in Rush Township, Jo Daviess County, Illinois the daughter of Glen and Anna (Kupersmith) Metcalf. Her family moved from the farm to Warren where she attended grade school followed by a move to Rockford, Illinois where she graduated from West High School in 1951. She was a nurse for several years following graduation from the Passavant School of Nursing in Chicago, Illinois in 1954.

She married her high school sweetheart, Richard Stanton Seeberg, on March 26, 1954 in Rockford, Illinois. Together they had four daughters, RaeAnn, Sarah, and twins Mary Elizabeth and Lisa Kay (d. 1963). Her family will always remember her kind heart, deep concern for the welfare of others, love of
