JANIS SUE WRIGHT, age 72 of Dumfries, Virginia died Wednesday, February 23, 2011 at her residence.

Mrs. Wright was born January 17, 1939 in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, daughter of the late Harold F. and Beatrice (Bohlman) Jeske. She received a Degree in Psychology and a Degree in Nursing from George Mason University and served in the U.S. Navy for four years and held the Rating of Trademan (Instructor) Third Class. Mrs. Wright worked for the Veterans Administration Hospital in Gainesville, Florida, and Washington, D.C. and retired in 1998 as a Registered Nurse, (GS12).
