Jesus Castillo, 69, passed away peacefully on Sunday, November 12, 2023 in Fairfax, Virginia surrounded by family.

Jesus is survived by his wife of 47 years, Elva; his children, Antonio, Araceli, Florisel and Erika; his grandchildren, and many other family members and friends here in United States and in Mexico. He will be deeply missed and his legacy of kindness and honesty will live on with his children.
