



John R. Groundwater Sr.

September 1, 1921 - October 11, 2024

On October 11, 2024, John R. Groundwater, Sr., of Alexandria, VA, passed away peacefully at the age of 103 at the Uptown Living Assisted facility in Manassas, VA. John was an avid reader who found joy in the pages of countless books. He cherished his time building furniture, rebuilding cars, fishing, and spending time enjoying his beach home in Kill Devil Hills, N.C.

Born on September 1, 1921, in London, Ontario, Canada, John became a U.S. citizen at age six, settling with his parents in the Washington D.C. area. He attended Anacostia High School and later worked as a draftsman with his father at the Torpedo Factory in Alexandria, VA. During World War II, he enlisted in the U.S. Army Air Corps at Bolling Air Force Base in Washington D.C. After successfully completing pilot training, he was commissioned a Second Lieutenant and flew 19 combat missions over Germany with the 8th Air Force, 453rd Bomb Group(H) in England, flying the B-24 Liberator "Male Call" until the war's conclusion.

Following the war, he returned to Alexandria, VA and married Marjorie Elizabeth Garrison of Earlysville, VA, who preceded him in death in 2011. John is survived by two sons, John R. Groundwater, Jr. and his wife Susan of Manassas, VA, and Jay S. Groundwater, of Atlanta, GA. He also leaves behind four grandchildren - Sean, Patrick, Kaitlin, and Catherine - and three great-grandchildren - Liam, Charlotte, and Lucy.

Always a smile - always interested in the other person - I read the comments of the staff above and thought they were blessed to have John as he was blessed to have them.

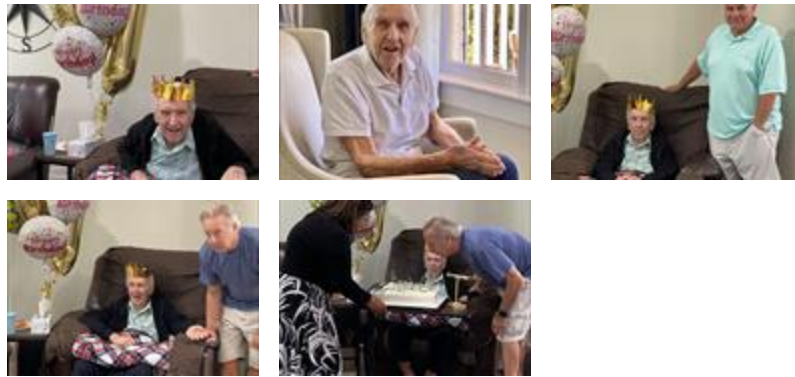
I hope that the family will let us know when the Arlington service is. I would sure love to attend!
