Beloved father and son, (John) Andrew Stowe, 51, died suddenly on February 14, 2024 in Fairfax, Virginia. He was born on May 21, 1972 in Indianapolis, Indiana. He lived a life filled with love for his family, friends, neighbors, colleagues and dogs.
