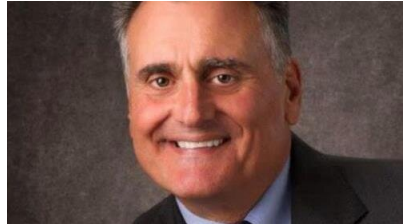

My most heartfelt privilege (and it truly was a privilege) about knowing John was our ability to talk about the happy times and sad times in our lives with each other, without equivocation. It’s impossible to put into words. This entire past year we had what we called our daily virtual Happy Hour - every day at 5 PM. We shared the good, the bad, the happy, and the sad news of the day and tried to help heal each other’s concerns about life, but also celebrate each other’s successes in life. Every day. There is now such a huge vacuum daily.

I'm sure I am leaving out something I wish I would've said here. I am still at a loss. I always will be. I will miss you forever my friend, just no words.

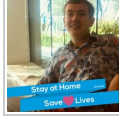
