COLIN JOSEPH WOLFE, LCPL USMC, age 19 of Manassas, Virginia died in combat while serving in Iraq on Wednesday, August 30, 2006.

Colin was born in Midland, Texas November 19, 1986. His early years were spent in Dallas, Texas and in 1991 Colin moved with his family to Manassas, Virginia. He was a member of Congregation Ner Shalom in Prince William County where he was Bar Mitzvahed in August 2000. Colin attended Jeannie Dean Elementary School, Grace E. Metz Middle School and graduated from Osbourn High School in 2005. Colin grew up playing baseball in GMBL, as well as many other activities. Colin danced from the age of 2 ' until he joined the Marines, participating in many of the professional productions of the Manassas Dance Company. Colin died doing what he believed in, serving his country and protecting his family.

He is survived by his parents, Mark and Amy Wolfe, one sister, Cecile Wolfe of Manassas, Virginia; paternal grandparents, Billy and Dorothy Wolfe of Amarillo, Texas and maternal aunt, Susan L. Grant of Los Angeles, California.

The family is holding visitation from 6:00-8:00 P.M. Sunday, September 10, 2006 at Pierce-Price Funeral Home, 9609 Center Street, Manassas where funeral services will be held 10:00 A.M. Monday, September 11, 2006 with Rabbi Jennifer C. Weiner, M.A.H.L. and Rabbi Jonathan Katz officiating.

Interment will follow at Arlington National Cemetery at 1:00 P.M. with full military honors.
