During his immediate job search, Tony spent every day with his beloved grandmother, Gladys Lansdowne, at Cameron Crescent Skilled Nursing Facility, always updating the family on her daily well-being.

Tony later worked at Home Depot and LA Fitness, where he enjoyed meeting and socializing with new people. Tony also took great pride in helping his mother when she started her business, GQ Cleaning. He was dedicated and hardworking, and she never received a single complaint about any of his work.

His passion for fitness was unmatched, and he loved staying active in the gym. Tony also had a natural athletic ability and enjoyed watching sports, particularly golf. His other hobbies included, passion for old cars which he shared with his brother Robert, as well as watching classic movies, such as Uptown Saturday Night, another of his favorite past times.
