March 16, 1913 - September 12, 2003

KATHERINE L. SINGER, age 90, of Gainesville, VA, passed peacefully at Prince William Hospital on Friday, September 12, 2003 with her family at her side.

Born on March 16, 1913 in Concord, MA, Katherine was the first woman from Concord, MA to enlist in the Women's Army Auxiliary Corp in February 1943. During her time in the service she met and married the love of her life, Sidney A. Singer. Katherine was selected for Officer Training and went to Officer Candidate School at Des Moines Iowa. Katherine was commissioned a second lieutenant and served her country with distinction. Upon leaving the service she dedicated her life to caring for her family and friends. She leaves everyone she touched with an understanding of a rich full life through love, laughter, and kindness to all.

Katherine is survived by her three children Arthur C. Singer and his wife Sandy, Richard D. Singer, and Sidra K. Seeley.
