Kenneth J. Kniceley died on September 28, 2014, in Prince William Hospital, Manassas, Virginia after a brief illness. He was born on September 14, 1932, in Warm Springs, Virginia to Jacob and Zella Kniceley. He was preceded in death by his parents and his sisters, Evelyn Weller and Virginia Kniceley. He is survived by his wife of 43 years, Carol; his daughters, Carol, Mary, Eileen, Cindy and Peggy; and by his sons, Michael and Kenneth. 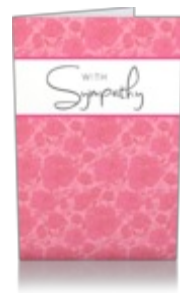
