



## KESA ISOHATA YEAGER

December 15, 1924 - April 7, 2021

Kesa "Kay" Isohata Yeager, age 96 passed away on April 7, 2021 at her home in Manassas, Virginia while receiving Hospice care.

She was born in Tokyo, Japan on December 15, 1924 to the late Sanshiro & Take Isohata. In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her late husband Edward Paul Yeager and her son Lawrence "Larry" Yeager.
