Lamar E. Wagner, age 86, of Gainesville, Virginia passed away peacefully at home on February 19, 2021 after a two-year struggle with a brain tumor. He and his wife of 55 years, Lois McCauley Wagner, resided for 46 years in Gulph Mills, PA.
