



## LaRue Ray Maynard

July 15, 1936 - October 19, 2020

On October 19, 2020, LaRue Ray Maynard, loving husband, father, grandfather, and great grandfather passed away at the age of 84 surrounded by his immediate family.

LaRue was born on July 15, 1936 in Wellsboro, PA to Homer & Ida Maynard. He served in the U.S. Navy and was honorably discharged as a Torpedoman's Mate 2nd Class. His position prior to retirement was with William A. Hazel, as shop foreman for 43 years.

He was married for 56 years to Gwendolyn Dawn (Cole) Maynard. They raised one son, Richard Lee Maynard (wife, Kimberly) and two daughters, Dawn Marie Miles (husband, Alfred) and Robin Jeanne Bell.

LaRue was preceded in death by his parents, brother George, and four sisters, Anna, Betty, Norma and Pricilla. He is survived by his wife, Gwendolyn and their three children, Richard, Dawn, and Robin.
