“ Larry M. Wyatt was my oldest brother. The first of ten children to Norman and Bertha Wyatt. In the early years we all lived a much simpler life. At such Larry was always looking for ways to make some extra money. For a few years he would gather logs during the summer and nearing the middle of August he, Kitty and Amy would show up on Saturday morning to begin the task of cutting up the logs into firewood and then splitting to make fire wood to sell. One day the conversation came up with a challenge of who could cut and split the most wood. One using a chainsaw and hydro log splitter. The other using an old two-man crosscut saw and a splitting maul (by hand). It was Larry on the chainsaw and my younger brother John and I on the crosscut saw. Larry arranged to have a reporter from the Washington Post the following Saturday. As the challenge began around 9:00 am Larry knew what he was going to do, while younger brother John and I just knew we could win, because we both were much younger and faster than Larry. Around 10:30 am we were ahead of Larry by almost two logs. And we had only been cutting. None of it had been split yet. Larry on the other side of the pile had stopped several times to rest and would begin again with splitting up what he had cut. After lunch, we all went back to working the challenge. When 4 o'clock rolled around between us we had cut around 5 cords of wood. Larry 3 and half and John and Joe, 1 and half. However, Larry's side was also split and stacked into 3 and half cords, while John and Joe 1 and half cords had all been cut with that crosscut saw. We still needed to split ours and stack it. The Post ran it on the front page of the Metro section the following Sunday. The moral of the story don't allow your mouth to bit off more than your butt can cut and split. The sub-moral is don't mess with my oldest brother Larry, cause he already had it figured out before John and Joe got up that morning.
