Lee Randolph "Randy" Johnson, age 72, of Manassas, Virginia died Tuesday, August 3, 2004 at Prince William Hospital.

He was a lifelong resident of Prince William County and had retired as a civil servant from Quantico in 1972 and then he worked for the Prince William County School Board as a small engines shop foreman until a second retirement in 1993.
